

DIVERSITY & INCLUSION

CREATING ACCESSFOSTERING BELONGING

Inclusionary housing is not only a social responsibility—it's a long-term investment in economic and community strength. By increasing access to quality housing across income levels, we help create neighborhoods where people from diverse backgrounds can live, grow, and thrive together.

All of our recent projects include ARCH-designated units, offered at rental rates ranging from 50%–85% of King County's median income. These homes provide greater access to newly built communities for individuals and families who may otherwise have been priced out of high-opportunity areas.

Through strong partnerships, local collaboration, and thoughtful development, we're expanding housing opportunities that reflect the full diversity of the communities we serve—supporting long-term resilience, social connection, and inclusive growth.



CONTINUED IMPACT IN REDMOND

In 2024, The Spoke delivered **21 income-restricted homes** through the ARCH program—reserved for households earning less than 50% of King County's median income—contributing **\$7.3 million in long-term housing value**.
